Brief Analysis

Comparative Workload.

Initial claims workload decreased in three of the four first payment categories (Interstate, UCFE and UCX) for the quarter ending March 31, 1993, when compared to the prior quarter (quarter ending December 31, 1992). Interstate claims decreased by 2.2 percent and UCX claims decreased by 9.5 percent. The largest decrease, however, was in the UCFE category; that category decreased by 11.8 percent. Initial claims workload increased this quarter, however, for the Intrastate category which went up 12.3 percent.

Initial claims workload also decreased in all four of the first payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate, UCFE and UCX) when compared to the same quarter a year ago. The most substantial decrease was in the Intrastate category; that category decreased by 22.1 percent. Interstate decreased by 19.0 percent and UCX decreased by 16.0 percent. The UCFE category only decreased by 5.8 percent.

There were increases in EUC initial claims for the quarter ending March 31, 1993 in all four of the payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate, UCFE and UCX) when compared to the prior quarter. Intrastate EUC

initial claims increased by 5.5 percent. The Interstate EUC initial claims increased less than a percentage point. The UCFE category had an increase of 6.0 percent this quarter when compared to the prior quarter. The UCX category had the most significant increase of 32.2 percent.

EUC initial claims workload increased in two of the four payment categories (Intrastate and UCX) when compared to the same quarter a year ago. The Intrastate category increased 11.9 percent. The UCX category had a tremendous increase of 114.6 percent for the quarter ending March 31, 1993. However, the remaining two EUC initial claims categories decreased this quarter. The Interstate payment category had a significant decrease of 23.0 percent. The UCFE category went down 8.7 percent the quarter ending March 31, 1993.

There were noticeable decreases in EUC continued claims workload in three of the four payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate and UCFE) for the quarter ending March 31, 1993, when compared to the prior quarter. The Intrastate category decreased by 3.0 percent this quarter; the Interstate category decreased by 7.1 percent; and the UCFE category decreased by 8.9 percent this quarter when compared to the prior quarter. The UCX category, on the other hand, increased by 7.6 percent this quarter.

There were substantial decreases in EUC continued claims for the quarter ending March 31, 1993 in all four of the payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate, UCFE and UCX) when compared to the same quarter a year ago. Intrastate decreased 81.0 percent. Interstate decreased 82.1 percent. UCFE decreased 83.3 percent. UCX decreased 71.8 percent for the quarter ending March 31, 1993.

Initial Claims Timelapse National Average.

For the quarter ending March 31, 1992, national averages for 14/21 days time lapse exceeded the appropriate Secretary's Standard (SS) or Desired Level of Achievement (DLA) for initial claims promptness for three of the four first payment categories (Intrastate, UCFE and UCX). The Interstate category performance was 67.9 percent this quarter which failed to meet the appropriate SS (70.0%) by 2.1 percentage points.

There was little change in performance this quarter when compared to the prior quarter. Intrastate and UCX performance each decreased this quarter by less than a percentage point. Interstate performance decreased this quarter by 1.7 percentage points. UCFE performance decreased this quarter by 4.4 percentage points.

When comparing initial claims timelapse for the quarter ending March 31, 1993, to the same quarter a year ago, there were slight increases in performance this year in all four of the first payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate and UCFE and UCX). The Intrastate category increased this quarter by 2.2 percentage points. The Interstate category had a noticeable increase of 7.6 percentage points. However, the UCFE category's increase was less than a percentage point this

quarter. The UCX category increased 3.1 percentage points this quarter.

States Achieving Secretary's Standard/DLA.

In the quarter ending March 31, 1993, benefit payment performance decreased in all four of the first payment categories in terms of the number of States achieving the Secretary's Standard/DLA. Both the Intrastate and UCX categories decreased by one State in terms of the number of States achieving the SS/DLA when compared to the prior quarter's performance. Similarly, both the Interstate and UCFE categories decreased by four States this quarter when compared to the prior quarter.

For the Intrastate first payment category, five States did not meet the SS/DLA (87.0%) this quarter. Those five States are as follows:

1. Virgin Islands (77.1%)
2. Alabama (77.6%)
3. District of Columbia (80.2%)
4. Puerto Rico (81.8%)
5. North Carolina (82.5%)

When comparing the number of States achieving the SS/DLA in the quarter ending March 31, 1993, to the same quarter a year ago, benefit payment performance increased this year in all four of the first payment categories (Intrastate, Interstate, UCFE and UCX) in terms of the number of States achieving the SS/DLA. The Intrastate category had eight more States meeting the SS/DLA in performance in this quarter. The Interstate category had a large increase of sixteen States. Whereas the UCFE category increased by only one State when compared to the same quarter a year ago. The UCX category had a significant increase this quarter of twelve States.
