



Unemployment Insurance (UI) Nonmonetary Determinations

4th Quarter of 2017


Workload



In the 4th quarter of 2017, the number of UI nonmonetary determinations decreased 7.4% from the previous quarter. The number of separation determinations decreased by 7.9% and the number of nonseparation determinations decreased to 6.8%.



In the 4th quarter of 2017, 48.0% of the determinations involving separation issues resulted in a denial of UI benefits, and 52.2% of the determinations concluded that the claimant was eligible for benefits. This ratio is very similar to previous quarters.




In the 4th quarter of 2017, 85.8% of the determinations involving nonseparation issues resulted in a denial of UI benefits, while the claimant was found eligible for benefits in only 14.2% of nonseparation determinations.



UI Separation Determinations Issues 4th Quarter 2017



In the 4th quarter of 2017, 66% of the determinations involving separation issues were due to a discharge, 33% due to a voluntary leave, and 1% due to other reasons.


UI Separation Denials Issues 4th Quarter 2017




In the 4th quarter of 2017, 76.7% of the determinations where the claimant voluntarily left the job resulted in a denial of eligibility, while states issued denials for only 34.4% of the determinations where the claimant was discharged from the job.

In the 4th quarter of 2017, the largest category of nonseparation determinations (37.0%) involved the claimant’s ability to work, availability for work, and compliance with the state’s active work search requirements. The second largest category (31.9%) related to reporting requirement call-ins and other.



In the 4th quarter of 2017, the category of nonseparation determinations with the highest denial rate was “Disqualifying/Deductible Income” with 100%, followed by “Reporting Requirement Call-ins and Other” with 91.7%, and “Other (Aliens, Athlete School)” with 89%.
