


# Unemployment Insurance (UI) Nonmonetary Determinations


1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of 2020

## Workload




In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, the number of UI nonmonetary determinations increased 5.1% from the previous quarter. The number of separation determinations decreased by 0.8% and the number of nonseparation determinations increased to 11.0%.

### UI Separation Determinations by Quarter




In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, 47.0% of the determinations involving separation issues resulted in a denial of UI benefits, and 53.1% of the determinations concluded that the claimant was eligible for benefits. This ratio is very similar to previous quarters.

### UI Nonseparation Determinations by Quarter




In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, 84.9% of the determinations involving nonseparation issues resulted in a denial of UI benefits, while the claimant was found to be eligible for benefits in only 15.1% of nonseparation determinations.

### UI Separation Determinations Issues 1st Quarter 2020




In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, 67.4% of the determinations involving separation issues were due to a discharge, 32.0% due to a voluntary leave, and 0.6% due to other reasons.


### UI Separation Denials Issues 1st Quarter 2020



In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, 76.5% of the determinations where the claimant voluntarily left the job resulted in a denial of eligibility, while states issued denials for only 33.3% of the determinations where the claimant was discharged from the job.



In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, the largest category of nonseparation determinations (36.5%) involved the claimant’s ability to work, availability for work, and compliance with the state’s active work search requirements. The second largest category (32.8%) related to reporting requirement call-ins and other.



In the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2020, the category of nonseparation determinations with the highest denial rate was “Disqualifying/Deductible Income” with 100%, followed by “Reporting Requirement Call-ins and Other” with 88.8%, and “Other (Aliens, Athlete School)” with 84.4%.
