

## Initial Claims (State, UCFE, UCX)

As provided in UIPL No. 13-20, ETA calculates the increase in claims activity on a rolling 3 month basis and compares the most recent rolling quarter number for each state to the same time period from the prior year. The results of these calculations are presented below and will be used by the Employment and Training Administration in determining if states meet the 10 percent threshold requirement to request Allotment II as described in UIPL No. 13-20.
